## CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATED IN BOMMANHAL MANDAL

### Rich tributes paid to Chacha Nehru

The teachers said that after the death of Chacha Nehru in 1964, his birth anniversary was celebrated as Children's Day in the country. Considering his popularity among children, a resolution was passed in Parliament to celebrate National Children's Day on November 14.
